The school year is picking up steam. We welcomed Kindergartners last week. Today is the first day of the year for students in our developmental preschool. We're starting to get our feet under ourselves at STEM.

Two reminders to help make sure your child returns home safely:

1. Please communicate any changes in pick-up routine to the office before 2:00 pm.
2. If you park and pick your child up after school, please do not collect them at the door before they are lined up in the playground. This allows us to account for all our students at dismissal.

If your child might be eligible for free or reduced price lunches, please submit an application October 1. This is important for several reasons, including school and district funding. 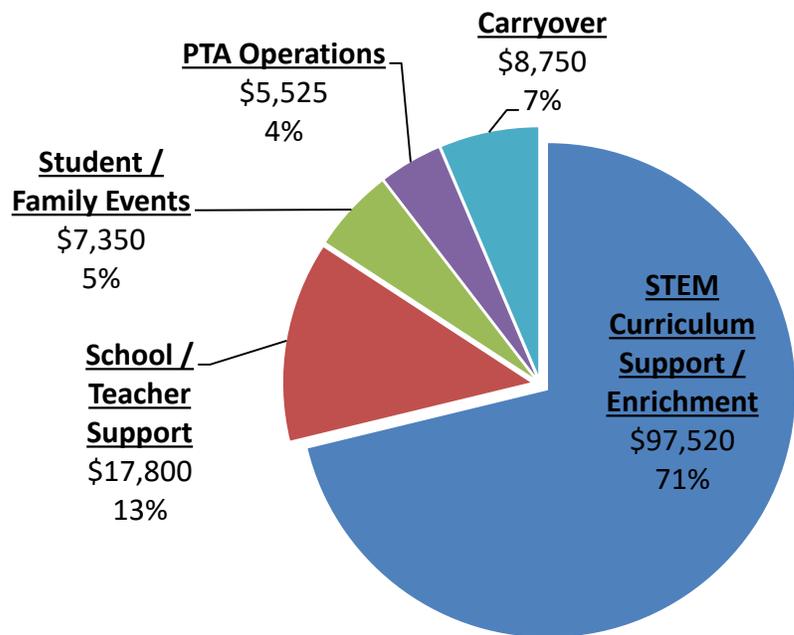
K-8 STEM PTA Kicks Off the School Year

This is in addition to the funds allocated for each teacher for supplies and PBL projects.

REMINDER: Parking Lot Rules of the Road
