      - a. PTA Exec Board met with Administration today to partner on safety concerns. Working on multiple workstreams to build a community of safety in the days/years to come
- b. BST meetings are public meetings and all are welcome to attend, many rules and regs mean only members may vote

# 12. Principal Check-In – Ben Ostrom

- b. News from SPS Board yesterday that 70 elementary schools may be consolidated into 50 (minus 20 schools) in the 2025-26 school year. The District has SPS Board's approval to further develop a plan.
  - i. No mention of K8 schools. May or may not be included vis a vis ambiguity
- c. Next year, Mr. O will be taking a year-long leave to focus on recovering from a 2022 accident
  - i. Choosing to forego right to return, meaning STEM may hire a principal following a full search for the best possible candidate
  - ii. Assume search process will start next week, likely to start with staff and family meetings
  - iii. Anyone interested in participating in any hiring committee must complete online training (quick). <u>https://www.seattlewea.org/membership-resources/interview-hiring-training/</u>
  - iv. Anticipate a candidate is selected by end of the year to get oriented before the school year is through
