1. Call meeting to order – Erin Eaton

a. Land Acknowledgment: The Louisa Boren STEM K8 PTA acknowledges that we are on the traditional land of the Coast Salish Duwamish people, including the first people of Seattle, the Duwamish People past and present, and honor with gratitude the land itself and the Duwamish Tribe

2. Principal's Update – Ben Ostrom

- a. Poem: Crumbs by Hal Sirowitz
- b. Restorative practices: framework for building community and belonging, requires foundation of positive discipline, emotional regulation. Will be a large focus through the year.
- c. Q&A
 - i. How is a conflict managed in the room? Do kids go to the office?
 - 1. Restorative conference is not right for every issue. Teachers are very skilled at managing conflicts.
 - 2. All classrooms teach self-regulation and have calm down spaces
 - 3. Sending to the office rarely solves an issue, but each situation is different
 - ii. Are there plans for differentiated learning in the classroom this year?
 - 1. Yes; there are plans for this every year as there are always ranges of skills in every room.
 - 2. That said, at the beginning of the year kids come in without the norms of classroom community, trying to assess and engage in whole class activities and instruction.
 - 3. Differentiated instruction is always and definitely part of the plan. Individual plans will come down to the classroom and teacher, but planning at the school level is also standard

- 4. Incorporating Universal Design of Learning
- iii. How is the morale in the school
 - 1. Many factors contributed to a heavy emotional and stress load at end of last year. Now understanding resources, and new year, the mood is lighter and more positive for staff and kids. Across the district not just the school.

3. Committee Updates

a. Tom Every, Treasurer's Report

- i. Mission and Values Review: Enhance STEM learning, Support PBL as a core tenet of curriculum, Enrichment, School/Staff support, Creating a safe space, and Student/Family/Community Building
- ii. Budget for the year is \$111K, expenses to date are \$43, income to date is \$0
- iii. Money coming from: Direct Give, Movie Night fundraisers. Can direct donate outside of fundraisers on the website. Stemk8pta.org
- iv. Money going to: Bank/membership fees, library
- v. As a PTA, the community we are supporting is the community that will continue. If there are things we want to do, we have to work together to make them happen. Everyone can pitch in.

b. Library Update - read by Erin Eaton from Ms. Bannister

- i. All classes have been through the library at least once, circulated 1,017 to students and teachers already this year.
- ii. Library can use help with shelving return books from PTA volunteers
- iii. Open lunch/recess library has been popular
- iv. Have been ordering books and they will process in late Oct/early Nov

c. Fundraising – Christy Markham

- i. Have an open seat for fundraising chair, but also happy to work with folx at the level they're comfortable participating
- ii. Fundraising ideas for Fall/Winter
 - 1. Direct Give starting Monday, will run 3-4 weeks
 - 2. Mod Pizza fundraiser is Thursday, 10/19, 20% of sales (mention STEM) comes to the school
 - 3. Mid-late November fundraiser to feature local business offers to support STEM, or STEM cookbook/calendar
 - 4. Idea to combine an International food festival with a cookbook opportunity
 - 5. If you can help, email <u>vp@stemk8pta.org</u>. Can help as lead, or colead. Taking on a specific event is most helpful, and Mary Ann can help with resources and directions

d. Enrichment, Lauren Brohawn

i. Enrichment is a set of extra activities before/after school that kids can sign up for. Normally carry a fee but scholarships are available.

- ii. This Fall will have registration opening on Tuesday, 9/26
- iii. Email Lauren with questions/suggestions
- iv. Looking for enrichment co-coordinator
- v. If you want to volunteer with enrichment or in the school, need to complete a volunteer application. Takes a few weeks; do it now and is good for two years. Every enrichment class has to have a parent volunteer. BUT if you're the parent volunteer, your kid gets to participate for free

- i. BLT: Building Leadership Team
- ii. BST: Building Safety Team

 - **h.** Covid: are there still notifications that go out for exposures, are there rules about quarantining, etc
 - i. SPS just update guidelines, available on seattleschools.org, no longer tracking or sending out notifications (dropped State rule) but protocol is you should test children with symptoms, stay home for 5 days if positive, return with a mask or without once you have a negative test
